CARE works with hundreds of thousands of people in Cambodia, particularly women who have **migrated to urban areas**, women and girls from **ethnic minorities** and rural women who are **denied multiple rights**.

In Cambodia, CARE focuses on a number of areas of expertise:



HEALTH RIGHTS

CARE works to ensure women have the **freedom to make informed choices** about their sexual, reproductive and maternal health. CARE supports health services to provide quality care, improves health knowledge at community level and ensures marginalised women have access to qualtiy health services without discrimination or stigmatisation. CARE encourages women to be vocal in **improving the governance of health services** and holding authorities accountable.



EDUCATION

CARE's successful multilingual education model is being scaled up across Cambodia. CARE continues to support secondary education approaches which are sensitive to the needs of girls from ethnic minorities and to address barriers which prevent girls from accessing education. CARE works to ensure the priorities of ethnic minority communities are represented in education planning and to improve school governance so they are accountable to their communities.



GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

CARE works to prevent, protect women from and respond to all forms of gender-based violence. CARE empowers women to know their rights and works with government, local authorities and the private sector to influence them to be more accountable. CARE engages with men and boys to change attitudes and behaviours which contribute to gender inequality and place women at risk.



ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

CARE works to ensure women have access to decent work through ensuring they receive fair terms within their employment, supporting opportunities for women to generate sustainable income at home and developing economic leaders within communities to advocate for the needs of women. This includes empowering women to make informed decisions about their finances and supporting them to plan for unforseen emergencies. CARE works to ensure women – particularly those from ethnic minorities – have resource security and diversified livelihoods to increase their resilience to climate change and natural disasters.



WOMEN'S VOICE

CARE works to ensure the **issues and needs of women are heard** by stakeholders from national to community level and within families. At the same time, CARE works with women to ensure they have the **knowledge**, **skills**, **confidence and access** to express themselves, make informed decisions and represent themselves at many levels to **develop the leaders of the future**.



HUMANITARIAN ACTION

CARE responds to emergencies when they occur and supports communities to recover, including helping communities to prepare so they are more resilient to future disasters.
